

# SUPPRESSION ORDER



## **Review of the Ministry of Justice and Department of Corrections handling of complaints regarding inappropriate workplace behaviour**

### ORDERS IN RESPECT OF PUBLICATION AND ACCESS

The State Services Commissioner certified that it is reasonably necessary that the provisions of the Inquiries Act 2013, as specified in section 9A(2) of the State Sector Act 1988, apply in relation to this review.

Under section 15(1) of the Inquiries Act, having taken into account the matters in section 15(2), the Review makes the following orders:

1. The name (or any identifying particular not included in the report) of the persons identified in the report by reference to being members of the working group from the Ministry of Justice and the Department of Corrections is suppressed for 50 years from the date of this order.
2. The file notes which record the interviews with the members of the working group from the Ministry of Justice and the Department of Corrections are suppressed for 50 years from the date of this order.

These orders are necessary to protect the privacy interests of those persons and reflects the need for this Inquiry (and future inquiries) to be able to ascertain facts properly by receiving information on a confidential basis when appropriate to do so. There is no countervailing public interest in their disclosure.
